The University of California, San Francisco, School of Pharmacy, Department of Clinical Pharmacy, is seeking applicants for a residency in Clinical Toxicology at the California Poison Control System (CPCS). The CPCS is a 24-hour per day emergency and information hotline serving physicians, nurses, pharmacists and other health care personnel as well as the public in managing poisonings. The CPCS also serves as a training site for pharmacy students and residents in Clinical Pharmacy Practice.

Preceptors include Certified Specialists in Poison Information (CSPIs), Medical Toxicology Residents, and Medical Toxicologists affiliated with the California Poison Control System.

Goals

The goal of the Clinical Toxicology Specialty Residency is to provide a challenging and stimulating post-graduate educational experience and to train a Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) graduate to function in a professional, administrative and research capacity in an academic environment and a regional poison control center.

- Competence in clinical management of poisoned patients
- Skill in preparing and presenting didactic lectures and clinical teaching to diverse audiences (School of Pharmacy, School of Medicine, Clinical Toxicology Service (rotation experience) and various health care facilities)
- Experience in designing and conducting clinical research
- Practice in preparing manuscripts for publication and lectures for professional presentation

Activities & Responsibilities

The resident will be encouraged to participate in elective rotations (emergency medicine, laboratory medicine, epidemiology, occupational medicine, clinical research, etc.) and UCSF didactic courses (school of pharmacy and school of medicine).

The resident will be responsible for:

- 1) providing poison information and poison exposure consultations
- 2) training and evaluation of PharmD and Medical students and residents taking the clinical toxicology elective
- 3) Co-teaching a UCSF therapeutics course
- 4) Completion and presentation of a research project
